Looking for Signs of Spring: Adult Fellowship Picnic and Walk

Sunday, April 25, 12:30 pm, Lagoon Picnic Area of Rocky River Reservation*

You are welcome to join us today for a walk at Rocky River Reservation! The Cleveland Metroparks has provided Char Vas with wildflower information, and Claudia Taller is equipped with a two-page spread of wildflower descriptions and pictures from Lorain Metroparks. We should be able to spot lots of tiny flowers as we walk the paths. Bring your brown bag lunch, drink, and walking shoes. Feel free to head home after lunch if walking in the woods does not fit into your schedule. There is a large shelter and restrooms. Currently the Metroparks are not taking reservations for shelters.

DIRECTIONS: *Lagoon Picnic Area - Columbia Rd.in North Olmsted to Cedar Point Rd. At the traffic light at the bottom of the hill (Valley Parkway), turn right. In .04 of a mile turn right into the Lagoon Picnic area (sign is on the left side of the road). Follow the road to the parking lot; the shelter is not visible from the Parkway.
