Support the General Commission on Race and Religion (GCORR)

Penny Sunday is December 19

The December Penny Sunday offering will support the General Commission on Race and Religion. The Racial Justice Group has been utilizing their podcasts and information online for over a year.

The commission was formed in 1968 by the church to keep "The United Methodist Church accountable in its commitment to reject the sin of racism in every aspect of the life of the church." Racism is their primary focus, which also includes poverty, gender discrimination, and more.

GCORR is at a critical turning point. Decades of denominational decline, coupled with the current conflict and instability in the church, have caused—and will continue to cause—a steep decline in funding, resulting in cutbacks to programs. The reality is that GCORR has been underfunded for years. Staff cutbacks have come when many local congregations are recommitting to confronting racism and most need institutional support.

With God's help and your generosity, we are calling in a future where GCORR becomes self-sustaining, with a wider reach and an exponentially greater impact than ever before. 
