## Strategic Plan To Be Unveiled!







# When in Our Music...

As we head into a new program year, one of the things to which I look forward is the restart of our choir program. One of my favorite hymns is "When in Our Music God Is Glorified," and music has a special relationship to worship. First, music is a gift from God. Music is a part of every culture on the planet. Music is part of our humanness. While there is a small percentage of humans that psychologists label as amusics, most people are innately musical. Young babies will move to a rhythm; and a fetus in the womb will respond positively to quiet melody. Music not only has a calming influence on people suffering from anxiety, research has shown that music therapy can have a significant positive effect on recovery in stroke victims. Brain scans show that certain areas of the brain are actually enhanced (grow larger) when people are exposed to music over an extended period of time. Indeed, music is a gift from God.

But there is a "flip side" to this equation, for we musical humans are called to glorify God through our music. We use music in worship to praise God, to sing of our joys, and to lament our sorrows. We use music in worship to express emotions when words just "don't seem to be enough." When I dedicate our Sunday morning monetary offering, I sometimes pray that we give back to God a small portion of what God has given us. The same is true of our music. We offer back to God the gift of music with which God has so graciously blessed us.

We, at North Olmsted UMC are especially blessed to have the music staff that we have. Every Sunday, Marlene does an outstanding job as our organist – playing several hymns and responses, prelude, offertory, postlude, and choir accompaniment. And Gabriela leads our chancel choir and bell choir, turning a real mix of untrained voices and uncoordinated hands into beautiful sounds. These

people spend many hours choosing music, studying music, practicing, and conducting rehearsals – all to further our worship to the glory of God.

And still, our music program would not be complete without the dedication of our volunteers – members of the choir and bell choir. These people give up one or two evenings every week, and are in church every Sunday to glorify God through the gift of music.

Yes, I look forward to the beginning of choir season. I give thanks to God for the gift of music and for the opportunity to glorify God through music; and I give thanks for all the people who come together to bring that gift to our church. "May God give us faith to sing always Alleluia."



In addition, you contributed almost \$200 and numerous items for the school supplies drive. Because the collection box kept overflowing, we made three deliveries of supplies to the pantry. Georgia Wilder, the pantry director, thought they would supply over 50 filled backpacks to North Olmsted students and have supplies left over to help others who did not receive a whole backpack. Can you imagine how important this help is for students who would not be able to get these items on their own?

We are currently collecting pasta sauce for the pantry, due Sept. 10. Beginning on Sept. 17th, we will be collecting canned meats and fish.

## September Penny Sunday for "Laura's Home"

Around thirty years ago a poor Methodist Church asked a not-quite-as-poor Methodist Church for help to help pay for one night per month for a supper kitchen. The latter church (NOUMC) decided it couldn't afford the \$125 from their budget, but a few people had the faith to believe the money could be raised by our members outside the budget, and the East Glenville Supper Kitchen project was started. But sending money was not enough, and so for one evening a month a group of volunteers also went to help with the meal.

When East Glenville closed, there was a desire to continue the project. It was found that Laura's Home would love to have help with one of their meals, so the project went on. Laura's

Home is a home for women and children, some battered, some homeless, some just not able to earn enough money to support themselves and/ or their children. It is run by the City Mission.

Please, remember that thirty years ago, it took \$125 to feed around 80 to 100 people most months. Today, through careful shopping, planning, and culinary know-how the same amount of clients are served for less than the \$125. Once again, however, this is all done because of contributions from church members and groups.
