Congratulations Church. . .

NOUMC received to Certificates of Appreciation from our District Superintendent and our Bishop at the Spring District Conference held on Saturday, April 21st. The first was for having received nine new members by Profession of Faith in 2017. The second was for paying 100 Percent of our District and Conference Apportionments. These certificates continue to emphasize that NOUMC is alive and growing in faith and in mission – making and maturing disciples for the transformation of the world.





The Spirit is Alive...

The scriptures tell us that forty days after the resurrection Jesus ascended to heaven. (We will celebrate the Ascension along with the Festival of the Christian Home on Mother's Day, May 13th.) Ten days after the Ascension, on Pentecost we're told the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples. Pentecost is a wonderful and often understated church holiday. Pentecost has been called the birthday of the church. At that first Christian Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples and gave them the strength, the faith, the power, and the courage to go forth and spread the Good News of God's amazing love as witnessed in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

People sometimes ask me if the Holy Spirit was created at Pentecost. No, the Holy Spirit always existed at one with God the creator. It's in the first Chapter of Genesis that we read, "The Spirit of God moved across the waters" to bring forth creation. I also find that sometimes Christians try to draw too sharp of distinction between the three persons of the Holy Trinity. I confess that I am fairly "unitarian" in my "trinitarian" beliefs. It was the twentieth century pastor and theologian Ralph Sockman that liked the term "tri-unitarian" and that term fits me fairly well.

I do not draw a sharp distinction between the "spirit of the Living Christ" and the "Holy Spirit." When I speak of Christ walking with us everyday of our lives, that's the Spirit. When I quote that last verse of Matthew's Gospel: "I am with you always, even to the end of the age" – that's the Holy Spirit. Truthfully, I prefer to think of God's immanent presence as the Spirit of the Living Christ. I find that more relational. I can relate better to a living Jesus than to an ethereal Spirit.

Still, whatever words we use, on May 20th we will celebrate Pentecost. We will celebrate the Spirit of the one living God, descending on the disciples in such a wonder-filled way that they were able to go forth to tell the whole world about God's



grace and God's mercy as personified in the life, death, and resurrection of Christ.

But we at NOUMC have more to celebrate than just the birthday of the church two thousand years ago; for, I firmly believe and truly sense that the Spirit of the Living Christ is alive and active in this church. I am truly excited to see rebirth that began with our 50th Anniversary Celebration and has continued with "Our Faithful Journey" planning. I am truly excited to see our congregation alive and active in the life of our church. I am excited that there is so much going on in the church that meeting space sometimes becomes a challenge. Indeed, we at NOUMC have much to celebrate. I hope you will join me on May 20th at we celebrate Pentecost and the glorious presence of the Spirit in the life of our church.
