

# Oberammergau Passion Play – September 2020



Rev. Mark and Ginny are headed back to Germany September 12-29, 2020, this time to see the Oberammergau Passion Play, and you are invited

to join them. The Passion Play has taken place every ten years since 1634, and depicts the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Over 2,000 Oberammergau villagers will participate in the 2020 play, almost half the town. Educational Opportunities has built a wonderful "Alpine Odyssey" tour of Southern Germany and Austria around the play including visits to some fantastic castles and churches and trips to Salzburg and Innsbruck. My last few Agape columns have concentrated on our Youth Mission Trip to Buffalo, New York; but I can't resist sharing one more. Some of you know that my work team was made up of four teenage girls (two of whom are thirteen), and two adult leaders, myself included. Our job was to repair Miss Fanny's front porch. When we arrived at the work site, we found a rotten porch deck, so badly deteriorated that it would not support our weight. The girls immediately went to work, tearing off that deck, as our mission trip leader went to the lumber yard to buy new decking. Then it became apparent that the support joists were also rotten - more lumber needed, more deconstruction and reconstruction. After replacing/ reinforcing the entire deck, it came time to put up new railing. On another trip to the lumber yard, we opted for vinyl railing - maintenance free, nice looking, and not a lot more expensive than wood. Then, as our week drew to a close, we decided that we needed to replace the stair railing as well, just to make things look good with all the railing matching.

But the really exciting news was shared at our Mission Trip Slide Show by Pastor Dee of Seneca Street United Methodist Church. Indeed, Miss Fanny is enjoying her new front porch – spending time sitting there, greeting passers-by, and enjoying the neighborhood. But, shortly after our young crew headed back to North Olmsted, the neighbor across the street decided to repair his front porch. Then two neighbors down the street did the same thing. Because of a week's work by four girls and two adult leaders, the entire neighborhood is getting a "face-lift" and folks are taking pride in their property.

But the Good News doesn't stop there. Miss Fanny, who lives almost across the street from the church, had not been to church in several years. Shortly after


we finished our week's work, she told her pastor, "Pastor Dee, you'll see me back in church." Our sharing of God's love has brought Miss Fanny into a closer relationship with her church; and hopefully a closer relationship with her Lord.

What's unsaid here. . . I got to know Miss Fanny fairly well in the week we spent working on her house; and I don't think she is going to be silent about her new relationship in the body of Christ. I'm willing to bet that, as Miss Fanny is sitting on her new porch, she'll be inviting others, maybe even dragging others, to join her in worship and service; and that's the way the love of God works.

There's a song that says, "It only takes a spark to get a fire going." Our humble crew created "a spark" in the Seneca Street neighborhood. Miss Fanny is creating more sparks; and the neighborhood is on fire with the work of the Holy Spirit. Thanks be to God for the opportunity to serve as we give God all the praise and all the glory.

# **Oxcart Pantry Collection**

You really came through in August for the Oxcart Pantry. We were able to supply 100 containers of beans, canned and dried. Besides that, between the school supplies you brought in and the money from Penny Sunday, which was \$209, and the money from the city, Georgia said they were able to give out almost 100 backpacks with school supplies to

North Olmsted students whose parents would have been hard-pressed to provide these items. Once again, thanks for helping your neighbors.

We are presently collecting soup for the pantry, which is due September 9, and we will then gather canned fruit with the due date of October 14. Remember that our goal is 80 items each month, and we're always happy to collect even more than that number.

#### **September Penny Collection: Laura's Home**

Even though we have been going to Laura's Home for several years now, I'm often asked what Laura's Home is and what we do there. Well, it's part of The City Mission but is located on the west side of Cleveland. They serve between 110 and 130 women and children and have a long waiting list. The clients live there with the hope that they will be able to get out on their own. They are homeless, and some are victims of domestic abuse. They are provided with help to find jobs, get further education, find a place to live, and get religious training. Because Laura's Home does provide religious training, it does not qualify for federal and state aid. Most of the money for Laura's Home comes from private donations. What we do there is provide one meal per month. We feed usually around 90 people each month for \$125, with some judicious shopping and great chefs. The money does not come from our church budget, but rather from donations from some of our church groups and individuals. This is where you can help. Our September Penny Sunday will go to this mission. Also, if at any other time during the year you would like to donate to this project, you can always put a check, made out to NOUMC, in the collection plate or in the church office with Laura's Home on the memo line.



By now, most of you have heard a lot about The Daniel Plan. The Daniel Plan is a special project of Rick Warren, Pastor of Saddleback Church and Author of *The Purpose Driven Life*, who teamed up with Dr. Daniel Amen, the "Brain Doctor" of PBS fame, and Dr. Mark Hyman, the Chair of the Cleveland Clinic Functional Medicine Department. The program takes its name from Daniel 1:8-15. This is a six-week program that concentrates on the five essentials of healthy living: Faith, Food, Fitness, Focus, and Friends.

Last Spring we had a very successful Daniel Plan Group meeting on Saturday mornings. However, Saturdays were not an ideal time for some people. Others

have developed interest after speaking with the Spring group. As a result, I will be facilitating another Daniel Plan Group on Tuesday evenings beginning September 11 at 7 pm. Our regular meeting will run for six weeks (September 11 through October 16). All are welcome to join this group, including those who were in the Spring group and would like to repeat. Please sign up on the office door.

The cost for The Daniel Plan Study Guide is \$8.00. I will order a Study Guide for everyone who signs up for The Daniel Plan. It is also highly recommended that you read *The Daniel Plan: 40 Days to a Healthier Life* book as we spend our six weeks together. If you check "Order a Book" on the sign-up sheet, I will order a book for you in addition to the Study Guide – the cost for the book is \$15.00. You can also order the book on amazon.com, and it is available on Kindle. (Note: The Study Guide is also available on Kindle, but you really need the Study Guide in hard-copy because there are sections to be filled in during sessions and between sessions.)

I cannot believe the summer is over and most of you have gone back to school already. I want to wish you all a very successful and blessed 2018-2019 school year. Remember, my door is ALWAYS open. If there is anything I can do for you, please do not hesitate to call or email me.
