Helping “4 Paws” Help Others

Every year our Children and Youth Sunday School classes choose a mission for which to raise money. I'm pleased to say they have always selected wonderful, meaningful, and worthwhile projects. They have raised money to provide safe drinking water to a water-starved village. They have raised money for guide dogs for the blind. They have raised money to support children in underprivileged situations. These are all areas of great need; and it's wonderful to both highlight these needs to our youth and to encourage them to help those less fortunate than ourselves.

All this being said, I was especially excited when, this past fall, I heard about 4 Paws for Ability, because I have personally witnessed the difference a service animal can make in the life of a child. In my previous church, we were contacted by a family asking if we could accommodate them including their very severely autistic young son whom I'll call Joe (*not his real name*). It became clear that, in order to welcome Joe into Sunday School, we would need a specially trained adult one-on-one with him at all times. Fortunately, the church mobilized to line up volunteers, give the training, and welcome Joe's family into our church family.

It was about a year later that we became aware that service dogs were being specially trained to provide stability and calm to children with severe autism. Again, the church mobilized and worked with the family to get Joe a service dog, and the results were truly amazing. After a few months with the dog, Joe became far more functional in church. He was able to take part in activities without total supervision. Joe's dog truly, significantly improved Joe's quality of life and the quality of his parents' lives.

Given my experience with Joe, when I heard that our Sunday School classes were considering 4 Paws for Ability as their mission project, I became very excited. I was told that the class hoped to raise about \$1000 or \$1500 for the project; and I said, “Oh, we can do better than that. If a dog costs the family \$17,000, let's raise \$6000 – roughly a third of the cost.” Maybe I was being overly optimistic, but I know the difference a dog can make.



Last month we received the details on the child for whom we are raising money. Brynlynn is a four-year-old girl with severe seizure disorders. I know how a dog can improve the quality of her life, and, as a result, the quality of her parents' lives. Our Penny Sunday offering on April 28 will be used to support the Sunday School efforts to get a 4 Paws for Ability dog for Brynlynn. I encourage you to give generously to this offering. Of course, if you're not prepared to give on Sunday, you can always write a check to North Olmsted United Methodist Church. Be sure to put *4 Paws for Ability* in the memo line. God has richly blessed us. May we use our blessings to be a blessing to others.

Sunday School Mission Project: 4 Paws for Ability

Donations due by the end of May

We have been assigned a child! Her name is Brynlynn. She is 4 years old and lives in Sandusky. Brynlynn was diagnosed in late 2016 with cerebral heterotopia (nerve cells/neurons in the fetal brain do not migrate properly during early development, causing seizures, dyslexia, and developmental delay), hemiparesis (weakness and mild paralysis on one entire side of the body), reflex asymmetry (when the head is turned to the side, the arm on that side will straighten and the opposite arm will bend), seizures, Todd's paralysis (focal weakness in a part or all of the body after a seizure), and schizencephaly (a rare congenital birth defect/malformation; symptoms include developmental delay, seizures, and problems with brain-spinal cord communication). Brynlynn's seizures will be a lifelong battle, and she may need brain surgery sometime in the future. Brynlynn is a beautiful little girl with a smile that can light up a room. She loves princesses, Paw Patrol, and animals. Her family has been trying to raise the \$17,000 needed so that Brynlynn can receive a seizure alert dog. It is our hope to be able to raise a significant amount so that we can help Brynlynn to receive her service dog! We will be wrapping up our fundraising efforts very soon so that we can send our proceeds off to Brynlynn's family in early June. Please be sure to have all donations in to Wendy or one of our youth by the end of May! We thank you very much for all of your support so far this year. Updated totals will be given in the June Agape.
