"Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see--I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." The Season of Advent

Coloring Through Advent

There is no question that our Advent season is going to look really different this year. We will not all be together to celebrate this very special month, but whether worshiping in the sanctuary or from the comfort of our couch, the meaning and purpose of Advent remains the same. Advent is the four week period before Christmas that celebrates the anticipation and coming of Jesus Christ, the Messiah. Each week of Advent has a specific focus that teaches us the true meaning of the season: the coming of Christ.

This year, we will have coloring pages available for you to color, one for each week of Advent and one for Christmas Eve, each representing the weekly focus of Advent: Hope, Peace, Joy, Love, and Christ. Packets of coloring pages will be available beginning on November 29 and will be available for pick up from a box




near the office entrance door. They will also be available in the weekly e-newsletters and announcements for you to print at home. Coloring pages should be completed in the traditional Advent order but can be colored in any way and with any medium. There will be pages for adults and some for kids, too. Coloring pages can be returned to the box at church when completed, and photos of them may be included in our online worship services during the month! This Advent season will look very different. May these coloring pages help you take advantage of this more relaxed Christmas season to focus on Jesus and the wonderful gift that God has given us!

Advent Worship Gets Creative!

As we prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of Christ this Advent season, we need your help! Because of the rising COVID numbers, we will not be able to worship in person, in our church building, throughout the coming Advent/Christmas season. So, we would like to invite you to share worship with us in creative ways! Here are a few ideas:

- 1. Create your own Advent wreath at home and *Take a Photo* to share in our worship service.
- 2. Unpack the Nativity scene from your attic or basement and set it up in a prominent place in your home. *Take a Photo* of it to share in our worship services!
- 3. Do your own "Hanging of the Greens" event in your home, complete with trees, garlands, nativities, and candles. *Take a Photo* to share.
- 4. Stand in front of your newly decorated tree and **Share a Short Video** of "What Christmas Means to Me this Year". These short video clips will personalize our worship as we "see" the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love of Christ in the Advent season in our church family's faces!
- 5. And finally...for the Grand Finale!!! Grab a candle, stand in front of your tree, nativity, fireplace, etc. and *Make a Video* of your family sharing the lighting of the candles (much as we do at the church on Christmas Eve). These videos will be put together in a slideshow to be shared at our Christmas Eve service during the singing of *Silent Night*.

Sunday School Mission Project: Africa University

More Africa University Facts

Thirty-six nations of Africa are represented in the student population. The majority of faculty and administrative staff are Africans. The official language at the university is English, which is also the official language of Zimbabwe. There are thirty-two buildings on the campus with four currently under construction. The 32 buildings include 12 dormitories, 12 senior staff housing units, a chapel, and a state-of-the-art library complex. The four buildings under construction include a student clinic, two housing duplexes for senior staff, and the building for the Institute of Peace, Leadership, and Governance. Approximately 52% of the student body are women. Although the university is United Methodist-related, students are members of various Christian denominations and other religions including traditional African.

This year, we hope you will support the Sunday School Mission Project by helping us raise money to build a new dorm for female students of Africa University! A new dorm will enable women from all over Africa to be housed in a safe place while completing their education. If you like the choice Oxcart Pantry made, you can order it on Amazon by clicking the link above and mailing the item from Amazon directly to Oxcart Pantry (choose the option: City of North Olmsted's Gift Registry Address.) The advantage to this option is that you don't have to leave home, and volunteers at Oxcart Pantry will do the wrapping and sorting for you.

Option 2 is that you can purchase your items on your own, wrap them, put the paper slip on the package, and take them to the church at one of the following times, when we will have an Outreach member there to accept them. (Please note: donations for the Hats and Mittens Collection will also be collected at these times.)
