

Support Africa University

Penny Sunday is April 18

As you know, our Sunday School classes this year have been collecting donations from the congregation for the Africa University Sunday School Mission Project. We have joined efforts with the East Ohio Conference to raise enough money to build a women's dorm at Africa University that will provide a safe, secure environment and a community of support for female AU students to focus on their education without risking their lives to attend university. The Teach Reach Bless Campaign to raise \$1.5 million has met its commitment goal only one year after the campaign was launched! To date, \$515,097.52 of committed funds have been received. The TRB campaign hopes to be able to send the full amount to Africa University in early 2022 so that construction on a new dorm for 90 additional female students can begin. The youth will be sending all money that they raise for Africa University to the Teach Reach Bless campaign at the end of May.

In April, all donations collected for Penny Sunday will be added to the amount the youth have collected. Please consider donating generously on Penny Sunday to this amazing university!

The Light of Christ Continues

Not long before he was crucified, Jesus and his disciples went to the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed, as Luke wrote, "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me, let not my will, but yours be done." In the last days of his life we were shown his humanness, which included a holy and steadfast belief that God was in control. When he prayed, he sought inner holiness, so he could endure and so he could show us his outward holiness, a glimpse of his love of God. He was willing to make that sacrifice, even as he struggled with it in a very human way.

Jesus served as an example to us in the way he lived. He put God first, and God's people second in his life. He showed us that God is always with us. We just need to listen and feel and search, as Christ did. Our inner holiness becomes our outer holiness so we can do God's will. Every time we pick up the phone to talk to a shut-in or prepare a meal for someone who needs it, we are letting our love of God, as John Wesley put it, reign supreme in our hearts.

It's not easy to be a disciple of Christ. We are not always confident that we're going in the right direction or doing God's will. We don't always set the best example—for fear and sadness, despair and depression often stalk us. God is there to hear us, to respond, to uplift us. Look to how Jesus lived, how he stayed the course, and how he died so we might know he was our Savior.

Racial Justice Symbol

The North Olmsted United Methodist Women formed a group last July to study racial inequities. We found that there are so many ways to be unconsciously prejudiced that we haven't stopped learning and trying to see what we can do about it. This image represents United Methodist Women's commitment to work for racial justice. It symbolizes a world of racially and ethnically diverse peoples working together side by side to create a world in which every person has a voice, rights, and opportunity for abundant life. Within the image are two hands joined together to work for justice for all God's children.

Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)

Contributions to traditional IRAs can be tax deductible, but withdrawals are included in taxable income. Account owners must begin taking annual withdrawals from traditional IRAs—called required minimum distributions (RMDs)—at age 70½ (now 72). These distributions must be included in gross income in the year the distribution occurs, and income taxes must be paid on the distribution's taxable portion.

Section 1201 of the Pension Protection Act of 2006 (P.L. 109-280) established QCDs, which allow individuals aged 70½ or older to exclude IRA distributions made directly to a qualified charity from gross income (26 U.S.C. §408[d][8]). (i.e. IRA account to church)

QCD features are as follows:

- -- Individuals must be older than 70½ when the QCD is made:
- -- Charities must be eligible to receive tax-deductible charitable distributions;
- -- Contributions must be from traditional IRAs

QCDs cannot be made from ongoing employer-sponsored IRAs (Simplified Employee Pensions [SEP-IRAs] and Savings Incentive Match Plan for Employees [SIMPLE-IRAs]) or from defined contribution retirement plans (e.g., 401[k] plans or 403[b] plans).

This feature allows for a QCD to count toward an individual's RMD (e.g., an individual who is required to take a distribution of \$5,000 in a year may elect to make a QCD of \$3,000, so that the individual only has to withdraw the remaining \$2,000 and include it in taxable income).

--The distribution must be a trustee-to-trustee transfer; that is, a direct transfer from the IRA to the charity.

Please consult your tax advisor or Financial Planner to see if this could help reduce your taxes this year.


