North Olmsted UMC has been faithful with their prayers and financial support for Africa University. Thank you, all! As the church continues to support Africa University, <u>please note that we will host a guest preacher, Josefa E. Bethea Wall, during worship at 10:30 am on Sunday, September 19.</u> It will be a special, informative, and celebrative time of worship on the 19th. Invite a friend to worship with us that day!

Please note the bio for Josefa and the following statement from the East Ohio Conference.

"Representatives of Africa University will preach in East Ohio Conference churches on Sunday, September 19 as part of Saturation Sunday to promote the University and our Teach • Reach • Bless campaign to build a new dorm for female students on the AU campus. The dorm will enable more female students to live on campus, meaning they will not need to find off-campus housing and commute to class – situations that make them vulnerable to untenable situations.



The East Ohio Conference Teach • Reach • Bless campaign needs to collect \$442,349 to reach our goal of collecting the \$1.5 million dollars needed to build and furnish the dormitory. A challenge gift from Rev. Bill & Marty McFadden will add \$1 to every \$3 collected in 2021. This means that if the campaign collects \$331,762, the resulting challenge gift from that amount of \$110,587 will put us at our goal of collecting \$1.5 million.

On Saturation Sunday, September 19, pastors, congregations, and faith communities of the East Ohio Conference are asked to share the story of Africa University and the Teach • Reach • Bless campaign. In supporting Saturation Sunday and the campaign we are showing our commitment to improving the education and wellness of women today for a better Africa tomorrow."

Bio of Josefa E. Bethea Wall,

Guest Preacher on Teach • Reach • Bless Saturation Sunday

Josefa E. Bethea Wall, a lifelong Methodist, is a native of North Carolina. She is the daughter of the late Bishop Joseph B. and Shirley C. Bethea. Motivated to be a servant leader, she has served the United Methodist Church in a variety of capacities. Currently, she is Director of Planned Giving for Africa University. She has served on the Advisory Development Committee for the university for over 20 years. She served as the secretary for the Board of Directors for the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry and was a member of the Loans & Scholarship Committee for one quadrennium. She continues to support the UM-related Black College Fund, for which she served as an ambassador in 1984 and 1985. Josefa has been a delegate to the World Methodist Conferences held in Waikiki, Hawaii; Nairobi, Kenya; Rio de Janeiro, Brazil; Brighton, England; and Durban, South Africa. In 2011, she was named a member of the World



Methodist Council. She has also served the church in her role as a freelance writer for United Methodist Communications.

Mrs. Bethea Wall has over 30 years of experience in community-building, grants management, and higher education. She has worked as Community Fund Grants Manager for United Way of Central New Mexico, State Coordinator for Citizen Schools - New Mexico, Director for the Albuquerque Bernalillo County Community School Partnership, Program Officer for the Moses Cone - Wesley Long Community Health Foundation, and Community Initiatives Specialist for United Way of Greater Greensboro. In each of her roles, she has focused on advancing sustainable community development by cultivating strategic partnerships, guiding the mobilization of nonprofit organizations toward collective impact, and engaging stakeholders in efforts to improve the quality of life for all.

Mrs. Bethea Wall received her baccalaureate from Bennett College in Greensboro, North Carolina, one of eleven historically black colleges supported by the United Methodist Church.

She has a Master of Public Administration degree with a concentration in Nonprofit Management from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro; a Nonprofit Management Certificate from Duke University; Process Management and Nonprofit Management certificates from the University of New Mexico, and an Executive Certificate in Religious Fundraising from Lake Institute. Josefa is married to her childhood sweetheart, Bryon Wall. Currently, Bryon is General Manager with Brookfield Properties.


