Lay Leader & Pastor Charge Conference Reports 2021

Pastor Hoyte Wilhelm has been very flexible as this year has been a combination of on-line services until April and then a combination of on-line and in-person Sunday services. His excellent communication skills were a very significant asset to making this combination a success. He has continued to help organize our committees and activities to run more efficiently consistent with *Our Faithful Journey*. Pastor Wilhelm led a Bible study group during Lent via Zoom and plans on leading one during Advent. He continued to send inspirational messages once a week during the time we were not having in-person services.

The North Olmsted United Methodist Church continues to work on our long-range strategic plan for continued future growth. Upon approval of our Administrative Board, the governance structure has been realigned into two councils, one focusing on administration and the other on program ministries. The purpose of this is to have a more efficient organization with less overlap of duties.

Sunday attendance for in-person service has been averaging 50 people along with YouTube viewers. The organist, choir director, choir, and members of the congregation have been sharing their musical talents with pre-recorded music. Our very talented organist has returned to in-person playing of the prelude and postlude. An adult Sunday school class has been meeting in-person since September. Until May this class was meeting via Zoom each Sunday morning.

Our church congregation continues to be generous in many ways. We continue to pick-up food from one restaurant and deliver it to a food pantry. Our once a month community meal is a "grab-and-go" meal. We continue to have a monthly Penny Sunday collection for a mission, such as UMCOR. We have resumed collections for the local food pantry, school supplies, hats and mittens, and other collections for those in need. These are just a few of our missions.

Financially we are good stewards. We are able to pay our district apportionments in full while supporting, making, and serving a free community meal along with paying the salaries and expenses of an active church. Our technology team continues to improve the technology system after the large project was completed last year.

One of our goals for the upcoming year is to revitalize the youth program. We have hired a new Youth Director who has been good at contacting our youth during the past year and planning events. We are now working toward contacting more children, from outside our congregation, as we have an aging congregation. Our theme for all of the church this next year is "Invitation". We hope to attract new members and families to NOUMC.

North Olmsted United Methodist Church provides many opportunities to praise and serve the Lord. Our goal continues to be to serve the community, feeding body and soul.

Hope in Action at North Olmsted UMC

I share and celebrate in gratitude the following ministries:

Governance Structure—implemented a new governance structure with the work of church leaders to enhance the effectiveness of planning, organizing, communicating, and offering ministries in and beyond the local church;

Three Ways to Worship on Sunday Mornings: In-person, Livestream, and Recorded—teamed with the pastor, technically and artistically gifted laity, organist, choir director, liturgists, and musicians in the congregation;

Technology—expanded ways to use new equipment for audio, video, and wireless capabilities in the sanctuary and throughout the building through the leadership of the experienced and professional Technology Team;

Zoom Connections and Some In-person Gatherings—offered through administrative meetings, fellowship gatherings, mission activities for all ages, study groups (e.g. racial and social justice), informal support groups, Adult Sunday School, one-to-one support and care; and outreach to the community of North Olmsted (e.g. float in Homecoming parade, passing out welcoming contact information about the church);

Caring Ministries—made possible through complementary work of the pastor and laity with phone calls, personal greeting cards, email messages, listening presence, prayer, and care;

Electronic Communications—developed through new features and updated information on the Website, Facebook page, weekly e-newsletter, and monthly newsletter;

Monthly Meals—offered to the community through pre-packaged hot meals, and a pickup process in the parking lot entailing safe distancing practices and the wearing of masks;

Financial Stewardship—received and continuing to receive financial support from members for the operating, building, and mission ministries of the church locally, regionally, and abroad;

Future Planning—met together as a Church Council and Council on Ministries to discuss actionable ways to live into a focused theme of "Invitation" in 2022 with people connected to NOUMC or desiring to connect with a faith community, ideally NOUMC.


