Support the United Methodist Committee on Relief's U.S. Disaster Response

Penny Sunday is January 16

As the humanitarian relief and development arm of The United Methodist Church, the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) assists United Methodists and churches to become involved in direct ministry to persons in need. UMCOR responds to natural or civil disasters of such magnitude that they overwhelm a community's ability to recover on its own.

Through UMCOR, United Methodists extend loving care to people within the United States. When disaster strikes, it is local churches that provide the first response to their communities. This basic understanding—that disaster response is local—forms the foundation for UMCOR's U.S. disaster training and response. When responding to a disaster in the United States, UMCOR provides training, financial assistance, expertise, and community collaboration to churches and partners, making them more resilient to disasters.
