Prayers for “All Invite” Workshop

Please keep in your prayers the church leaders who will gather for the “All Invite” Workshop led by Beth Ortiz, Director of Strategic Ministries with the East Ohio Conference of The UMC, on Wednesday, August 31 from 9 am to 11:30 am at the church. The workshop participants are Sarah Jackson, Craig Mueller, Claudia Taller, John Vas, Andy Walsh, and Pastor Hoyte.

A review and action-oriented discussion will take place based on the two books: *BLESS: 5 Everyday Ways to Love Your Neighbor and Change the World* by Dave Ferguson and Jon Ferguson; and *Remembering Your Story, Revised Edition: Creating Your Own Spiritual Autobiography* by Richard Morgan.

Beth will also direct the participants in beginning to envision how we and others in the congregation can continue to live into the focused theme of “A Year of Invitation” with one of the primary “Priority Programs for 2022” being: “All NOUMC members commit to inviting at least one person to an event during 2022.”

Our primary action step with this program will be to: “Form a work team to develop and conduct an education session to help members develop best practices for invitation, and help members to get over any discomfort with inviting others.”

Beth will help us to learn more about how to listen, invite, and disciple people into an active faith relationship with God and Jesus Christ while potentially connecting them with the ministries and missions of the local church. A goal is to strive toward *making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world* consistent with the mission of The UMC. In addition, a goal is to experience fruit which is reflective of the local church's mission of: “Feeding the Community—Body, Mind, and Spirit.”

Collecting summer side dishes until August 28

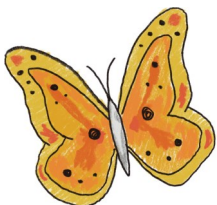
The 50 breakfast items we donated to Oxcart Pantry in June were well-received—thank you! In July, we took a break from collecting food to collect school supplies, which are an important collection item for families who need extra help preparing for the school year in North Olmsted. In August, we are again collecting food: summer side dishes. These include **canned corn, green beans, chick peas, baked beans, salsa, pasta, salad dressing, black beans, and beets**. Thanks for your help.

NOUMC Main Garden Update

Have you noticed some changes in our main garden? You may have seen a grid of string, or maybe little people working in the garden? They are Junior Girl Scouts of Troop 71067 who meet at our Church on Sunday afternoons.

For the Bronze Award they are required to come up with something to help their community, plan, fund, and then do all the work. They have to each put in at least 20 hours on the project, although our Scouts will put in much more than 20 hours! They took on the gardens as a way to say "Thank You" for the meeting space at NOUMC!

The small sticks with butterflies indicate where they have planted a plant that attracts butterflies. Some plants are donated or purchased and some started as seeds. They have painted the Peace Pole and are awaiting the lettering to complete it. Look for other changes as the summer progresses! The girls will maintain the garden through the summer with a weeding and water schedule.
