21-Day Social Justice Challenge

September 14 – October 5

What is a Social Justice Challenge? Social Justice Challenges have become popular following the death of George Floyd and the increasing growth of the Black Lives Matter movement. Online challenges have been offered by many religious and non-profit organizations, including The UMC. Most include links to digital resources on social justice issues and/or prayer and devotions. The idea of spanning 21 days comes from the theory that it takes 21 days to make or break a habit.

I participated in one this past spring sponsored by the Greater Cleveland YWCA. Every day I received an email with links to three to five online resources on social justice issues. They were a mix of written content, podcasts, and videos varying in length from a few minutes to an hour. I found the content very interesting, and it increased my understanding of social justice issues. I found some issues I wanted to act on, some groups I wanted to become an ally for, and a great deal to pray about.

The NOUMC Racial Justice Group members have looked at many resources in the three years they have been meeting and thought a 21-day challenge would be a great way to share some of that content. Our challenge will begin on Wednesday, September 14 and will run through October 5. Participants will receive a daily email with links to online social justice issues. There will be a description of the topic and type of resource as well as how long it takes to view or listen so you may choose the ones that interest you and fit your schedule.

During the challenge we will meet to discuss what we have learned. The meetings will most likely be on Wednesdays, September 14, 21, 28, and October 5. We will determine the time and if we will meet via Zoom and/or in-person after polling the participants availability. You are welcome to participate in the NOUMC Challenge even if you cannot attend the meetings.

Support Laura's Home Women's Crisis Center

Penny Sunday is September 18

September's Penny Sunday offering will go to help finance our mission to feed the women and children at Laura's Home. Every month a group from our church and our wonderful chef and food shopper feed the people at Laura's Home.

Our congregation has a long history of providing free meals. Over forty years ago an East Side church asked us to provide \$125 a month to pay for a meal at their supper kitchen. Most at that Administrative Board meeting said we couldn't afford to do that. Nell Jensen spoke up and said that we should meet the request with donations and not from the church budget, and not only that, we should send volunteers to work at the kitchen once a month. For over twenty years we supported East Glenville Supper Kitchen until the church closed. So, we found another place in need: Laura's Home. Over this whole period, the cost has been kept at \$125 to feed about 100 people.

Over the last couple of years, donations have dwindled, and our part in this mission is in danger of not being able to continue; this month's Penny Sunday will provide an opportunity for you to support this important ministry of the church. *Make checks payable to NOUMC and write* **September Penny Sunday** or **Laura's Home** in the memo. Send checks to the church office, attention Financial Secretary. For those worshiping in person, a basket will be designated for Penny Sunday.
