The children are also helped in many ways, such as schooling, tutoring, and help as needed. The same type of help is given to those on the street in downtown Cleveland. A home is given to those who want it or sometimes just a warm meal and warm place to spend a night. This serves mainly men and helps many to get back on their feet. There is also a children's program called Pathways. It provides help during the summer especially for children who have parents who need to be somewhere else. Help is also provided during the school year with after-school programs and tutoring. We think you can see how much good your financial help will provide to such a busy organization.




