- 2. My email and cell phone will remain active; however, I will be using them for personal communication, only, and not for matters regarding ministry with NOUMC and Rockport as that will be the responsibility of Pastor Tennille and the laity of both churches.
- 3. I will not be present at the church for at least a year after June 27 unless invited by Pastor Tennille, at which time I would discern very carefully and prayerfully if it would be fitting for me to do so. While we will always remain connected in Christ, be mindful that Pastor Tennille is your new pastor. I trust that you will respect this and will receive her very openly, lovingly, and supportively as you did with me.

Thank you for understanding my desire for us to maintain these healthy boundaries and to respect Pastor Tennille's ministry with NOUMC and Rockport.

Concluding my full-time ministry at NOUMC after nearly 30 years of pastoring at six churches has been rewarding and priceless beyond measure and makes me smile! Please know that I will always love you and will keep you in my prayers for all the best in faithfulness as brothers and sisters in Christ.

Finally, I am excited about the ways God will bless your ministry with Pastor Tennille in the months and years to come.
