UWF News—From Barb Andrews

We are continuing with our leisurely summer of Wednesday lunches. Would love to have you join us. We had a fun luncheon with the Berea UWF and hope to continue to share programs with them.

Mission News—From Barb Andrews

We were able to take over 90 canned and packaged fruits to the Oxcart Pantry. In August, Georgia suggests we collect lunch snacks. This would include little extras if you were packing a lunch, such as chips, crackers, Twinkies, candy bars, etc. You can use your imagination this month and think of something you might have been happy to see in your lunch on school days.

Each month some NOUMC members join John Duffy to prepare a meal for a Catholic charity supported charity at the Lorain Men's Shelter. This is a year round building that can house 50 men overnight. These are men who are homeless or close to homelessness, and the workers there pay particular attention to men with special needs. The meal we provide costs \$125 or less and always has some left over to provide other meals later on. In August, our Penny Sunday collection will go to help with the cost of those meals.

We have a final count for the Dean's plant sale. The profit was \$1093.33. Thank you for all your support, and this will give us money to give back to the church at the end of the year. We hope you are enjoying your plants again this year.

Financial News from our Treasurer, Andy Walsh

NOUMC has a generous congregation. Through its regular giving, the congregation donated approximately \$99.700 to support NOUMC during the first half of 2025. In addition to its regular giving, the congregation also donated approximately \$23,500 to specifically targeted global and local ministries, including a generous farewell gift for Pastor Hoyte.

A total of \$1,700 was earned in rental income for the half. An \$8,000 special gift was received and is currently unallocated (included in targeted donations for now). In total, revenue for the first six months was approximately \$4,300 under budget. This difference is partially attributable to some full-year prepaid pledges not being donated until June. It is expected that a portion of that shortfall will reverse in the second half of the year. Total expenses during the period exceeded the budget by approximately \$3,000, mostly related to the unexpectedly cold weather during the spring. Expenses for salting the parking lot and heating the building were more than anticipated. Insurance premiums also have increased substantially this year.

The church's endowment fund earnings were approximately \$16,700 (7%) for the first six months of the year. The financial markets have been volatile during the first half of the year, and that volatility is expected to continue throughout the rest of 2025.
