“Why Did Jesus Have to Die?” by Adam Hamilton

The New Testament authors didn't settle on one meaning of the crucifixion but instead offered a dozen or more metaphors to explain how it saves, but often without a clear explanation of how Jesus's death accomplishes the saving work they describe. Because of this vagueness, wrapping our minds around the logic and meaning of the cross can cause us to miss the full impact it can have on our daily lives.

Adam introduces readers to several theories about how Jesus' death brings us into a right relationship with God—the reality that in Christian doctrine is called the atonement. Rather than choose one single theory above all others or understand any of them as mechanical transactions, Adam argues these theories can complement each other and work together to give us a fuller and deeper understanding of why Jesus died and what his death means for us.

**This week we will discuss the Penal Substitutionary Atonement and Sacrificial Offering.**

Bible verses include Romans 6:20-23, 2 Corinthians 5:15-21, Hebrews 10:10-14.
